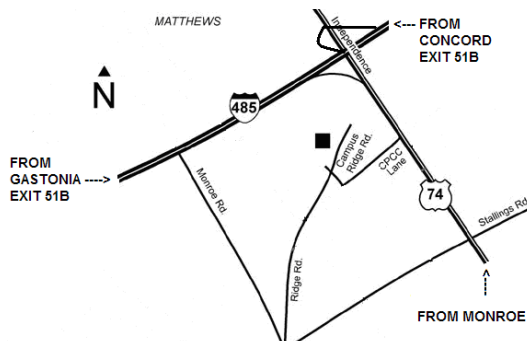

THE SYLLABUS

The final syllabus is being completed and session presentations being prepared. Below is a brief explanation of the courses being provided.

BACHELOR OF COMMISSIONER SCIENCE

Upon completing Commissioner Basic Training, this is the first level of Commissioner College focusing on improving unit service (For Unit or Roundtable Commissioners or others who have not previously attended college).

MASTER OF COMMISSIONER SCIENCE

This course focuses on continuing your education in learning how to better serve units. It will provide tools and techniques necessary to provide “Lifesaving” methods. There are also courses intended for District or Assistant District Commissioners geared toward learning more about the administrative methods needed to excel as commissioner.

DOCTOR OF COMMISSIONER SCIENCE

The final step in completing the traditional commissioner coursework. Sessions will assist the commissioners in writing their Thesis or Project.

POST DOCTORATE

This session is for participants who have completed the doctoral course of study. It focuses on honing one’s commissioning skills and broadening awareness of current commissioner resources, thus adding value and increased readiness in providing a high-level of support to assigned units/fellow commissioners.
